Tell someone you trust...

If you feel:

Like you're being made to do things you're not comfortable with

Disrespected or powerless

That you don't have any control

That you don't have a choice or other options

"Don't tell anyone"

"It's our secret"

"You owe me"

"I need you to do something just this once, for our future together"

▲ If you notice these warning signs:

Isolates you from family and friends

Buys you lots of expensive things

Encourages you to skip school, miss curfew, try drinking or drugs

Promises you a better life

Encourages you to be secretive about them and your whereabouts

Know the **signs**. Trust your **instincts**.
